Online WACE language enrolment applications

The School Curriculum and Standards Authority (the Authority) is delighted to report that many students are successfully completing their online *Application for permission to enrol in a WACE language course in 2022* in the student portal (https://studentportal.scsa.wa.edu.au/).

At the beginning of Term 3, please encourage your Year 10 students, and Year 9 accelerated students, to complete their online WACE language applications in the student portal.

Schools will then upload the three supporting documents, and complete the teacher declaration, and principal or deputy principal endorsement in the SRMS portal (https://srms.scsa.wa.edu.au/).

To assist students and schools with this new online application process, we have prepared user guides and other resources, which are available on the Authority website.
