Priorities 2024

Our priorities

- Adopt and adapt the Australian Curriculum version 9 within the Pre-primary to Year 10 Western Australian Curriculum – Science, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences and Technologies.
- Support teachers to familiarise themselves with the revised Pre-primary to Year 10 Western Australian Curriculum – English and Health and Physical Education, prior to implementation in 2025.
- Review the Pre-primary to Year 10: Teaching, Assessing and Reporting Policy and Policy Standards: Pre-primary to Year 10: Teaching, Assessing and Reporting Policy.
- Continue to pilot the collection of Pre-primary to Year 10 achievements in collaboration with the school systems/sector.
- Embed and strengthen Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives in resources and services.
- Progress the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) refreshment, by prioritising immediate, mid-term and long-term enhancements.
- Successfully deliver the Western Australian Statement of Student Achievement (WASSA) and the WACE.
- Maintain best-practice information controls to protect our systems and data from unauthorised access and disclosure.
- > Explore the use of technology to support future-focused pedagogies and assessments.
- > Provide teachers and schools with information that is clear and explicit and easy to implement, avoiding duplication, unnecessary work and any misunderstanding of expected requirements.
- > Consolidate and, subject to funding, continue the Authority's offshore international program aligned with the Western Australian Government strategy.
